

Learning to write with Scribolino: Pens and pencils from scribbles to handwriting

A new school of thought in a class of its own: Scribolino is a new range of products by Faber-Castell to help children learn to write, designed specifically for the various phases of their development. New products have now been added to the ranks of the well-established range of writing implements for learning to write, such as the propelling pencil and the school fountain pen. All its colourful pens and accessories meet the needs of children as they develop, helping little wordsmiths to enjoy writing as an important tool for self-expression.

Developing fine motor skills is the basis of developing a personalised handwriting. The **Scribolino propelling pencil** supports these skills in a child's first years at school. Its ergonomic barrel promotes the ergonomic triangular shaft and provides the highest level of writing comfort. The soft 1.4 mm lead is simple to adjust, while an integrated spring in the propelling pencil ensures that the lead does not snap, even if the child puts heavy pressure on the pencil while writing. The Scribolino propelling pencil is available in blue and blackberry shades.



And the new smudge-free **Scribolino eraser** available in blue or blackberry shades leaves no trace of any mistakes that might be made here or there.



The **Scribolino school fountain pen** provides the ideal support for individually developed little hands. Its ergonomic grip zone and robust nib with iridium core tip makes professional writers out of primary school children. The pen cap with its triangular shape is a practical anti-roll feature while the viewing holes let you keep a check on the ink level. The Scribolino school fountain pen holds standard cartridges and is available in a right-handed and left-handed option in four colour combinations: blue, blackberry, anthracite/blackberry and grey/red.



The new **Scribolino ink rollerball pen** which writes smoothly whether you are pulling or pushing it across the paper is an alternative to the school fountain pen. The wide, soft grip zone is designed for a relaxed and correct grip for both left-handers and right-handers. The writing tip is the latest innovation, as it is replaced whenever you change the cartridge, ensuring consistently smooth writing with even line width from start to finish. The Scribolino ink rollerball pen with its special ink rollerball refills with royal blue erasable ink is also available in blue and blackberry shades.



The new **ink eraser pen** is a practical tool when it comes to writing in ink. Three series of motifs that appeal to children adorn the surface, and the three standard eraser tips F, W and M make easy work of mistakes, whether they are written in the standard blue cartridge ink or with the new Scribolino ink rollerball pen. The blue correction tip is available to write over the erased ink.
